Last night the Champions League final was won by Chelsea, who beat Bayern Munich on penalties after the match finished with a 1-1 draw at the end of extra time. The goalkeeper Cech and the striker Drogba were the two best Chelsea players. Chelsea had never won the Champions League before.

The Olympic torch, which has been taken all over Greece in recent weeks, has finally reached England. It will be carried on an 8,000 mile journey up and down the country by eight thousand torch-bearers in relays in advance of the Olympic Games in London in July. The torch will be paraded through over one thousand different cities, towns and villages.

In the USA, the G8 summit in Camp David has finished, with no substantial progress but an agreement that the economic recovery should focus on growth and job creation alongside controlling budgets and debt levels, which should have satisfied the new French president.

Perhaps more significant was the statement by the G8 leaders that Greece should remain a member of the eurozone, putting more pressure on the forthcoming¹ re-run of the general election there, which might become a referendum on the Euro. There is a grave² risk that if Greece fails to implement the austerity measures agreed with the Central European Bank and the IMF, then it will go bankrupt and have to default³. If this happened and the eurozone didn't help it, then Greece might be forced to leave the Euro, although noone seems to think that this will do anything other than make the situation worse for Greece and threaten⁴ another crisis in confidence in the European banking system.

Italy has been having a tough weekend, with firstly a bomb being set off⁵ outside a school in the southern town of Brindisi, killing one girl and injuring six more, and secondly an earthquake striking in the small hours of Sunday morning near Bologna. It has been reported that six people are known to have been killed, but as the figures are still coming in, this number may rise.

Yesterday the Life Ball in Vienna was held. It was the 20th anniversary of the event which highlights and raises money for the fight against HIV/ AIDS. It is one of the biggest charity events in Europe, raising over €2 million in 2011 and being a significant international event for Austria.
